## Ski Resort Report 2026

The latest consumer research from Post Office Travel Money reveals that significant numbers of Britons intend to take a winter sports holiday this year – with one-in-twelve planning to travel to ski resorts this winter\*.

However, the 19th annual **Post Office Ski Resort Report** produced in partnership with **Crystal Ski Holidays** reveals that they are likely to have to pay more for their ski holiday because its research has found that prices have risen by an average of over 10 per cent since last season. This makes careful destination choice an important consideration for British skiers in search of the best value.

32 ski resorts have been surveyed this season for adult skiers (see Figure 1 opposite) covering nine European destinations: Andorra, Austria, Bulgaria, Finland, France, Italy, Norway, Spain and Switzerland. Local prices for lift passes, ski and boot hire and ski tuition plus lunch and drinks on the ski slopes were researched by Crystal Ski Holidays and converted to sterling by Post Office Travel Money so British skiers can compare the costs they are likely to incur on a one-week holiday.

Italian resorts again dominate the Ski Resort Report top ten. Led by Bardonecchia in the Piedmontese Alps, which has retained its position as the cheapest destination, they take six of the leading ten places. Bulgaria's Borovets and Bansko ski resorts are also bargain contenders while Geilo in Southern Norway enters the top ten in third place. France's Le Corbier resort has also entered the top ten in seventh place. However, prices have risen in all 32 of the resorts surveyed.

Laura Plunkett, Head of Post Office Travel Money, which accounts for one-in-four UK currency transactions, said: **"As a result of sterling's fall in value against European currencies in recent weeks, costs in ski resorts are likely to play a big part in destination choice this year – especially as our research again found that prices vary dramatically across Europe.**

**"The weaker pound makes it vitally important for skiers to do their homework before booking and factor in the higher cost of ski passes, equipment and ski school in resorts to the package price. The great value available in Italy and Bulgaria make their resorts a good choice for cost-conscious skiers. However, Norway's Geilo and Le Corbier in the French Alps are lesser-known resorts that also offer excellent value for bargain hunters."**

In the barometer of costs for family skiers, Italy's Passo Tonale resort has retained its place as the best value of 30 ski resorts for the second year running. In common with the main barometer, prices are on the rise. The only resort to show a fall in ski costs was Soldeu in Andorra.

## Best value resorts for adult skiers

Led by Bardonecchia, Italy again emerges as best value overall out of 32 European ski resorts surveyed for the 2025/26 winter sports season, according to the latest research by Post Office Travel Money and Crystal Ski Holidays.

However, the research found that British skiers can expect to pay more wherever they choose to ski because prices have risen by an average of 10.2 per cent year-on-year across all resorts as a result of both sterling's falls against European currencies in recent weeks and local price rises.

Rises in the cost of lift passes are the biggest driver of these local price increases. Britons travelling to European ski resorts can expect to pay an average of 10.7 per cent more for a one week lift pass than a year ago and in some cases the cost of a pass has more than doubled over the past 10 years (figure 2). While a 22 per cent fall in sterling's value over the past 10 years is undoubtedly a factor, the rises between now and 2016 are marked.

Interestingly, a comparison of lift pass costs now and in 2017 – the first year it was surveyed – show that Bardonecchia bucks the trend. A six-day pass costs £174 now compared with £155 nine years ago – a rise of just 12.4 per cent. This explains why the Italian resort has overtaken its Bulgarian competitors, where lift prices have seen significant increases in recent years.

- Bardonecchia tops the value rankings for the second year running and is one of six Italian resorts to feature in the top 10. Although the cost of a week's skiing has risen by 10.5 per cent year-on-year to £601 – a consequence of higher meal prices, Bardonecchia remains by far the cheapest ski resort in the survey.

## Best value resorts for adult skiers (continued)

- The closest competitor to Bardonecchia is Bulgaria's Borovets, where prices are over 11 per cent higher at £668 – and almost 19 per cent more than last season. In fact, Bulgarian ski resorts have recorded the biggest price increases this year. A second resort, Bansko, has fallen to fourth place in the barometer table after prices rose by 23.3 per cent to £706.
- Norway's Geilo takes third place in the table with a barometer cost of £704 – just 0.1 per cent more than a year ago and the smallest increase across the 32 ski resorts.
- The other Italian resorts to feature in the top 10 are: Sauze (5th, £732, prices up 10.2 per cent), Sestriere (6th, £743, up 4.7 per cent), Cervinia (8th, £817, up 10.5 per cent), new entrant Kronplatz (9th, £835, up 6.7 per cent) and La Thuile (10th, £836, up 15.7 per cent).
- There is no place for either Austrian or Swiss ski resorts in the best value top ten, but one French resort makes the list. Le Corbier has returned to the leading ten ski resorts in seventh place with a barometer total of £784, 5.4 per cent up on last season's levels. The highest-placed Austrian resort is Soll, 18th in the Ski Resort Report table with a total cost of £965 (+7.7 per cent), while Saas Fee is the lower-priced of two Swiss resorts in 30th place at £1,265 (+11.8 per cent).

- Wengen in Switzerland again rates as the most expensive of the 32 ski resorts surveyed at £1,372 for the barometer items, more than double the cost of the same items in Bardonecchia and Borovets. However, prices have risen by only 4.8 per cent year-on-year.

## Best value resorts for family skiers

In common with the main barometer for adult skiers, prices have risen in all barring one of the 30 ski resorts recommended for families. The high cost of tuition is one of the main drivers of higher prices, with increases of up to 67 per cent year-on-year recorded for ski school.

Once again, Post Office Travel Money and Crystal Ski Holidays found that the overall cost of one week on the slopes for a family of four varies dramatically across Europe, with the cheapest ski resort, Passo Tonale, costing half that of the most expensive, Saalbach.

- Passo Tonale has retained its position as best value for families on a budget, seeing off all competition because of its money-saving free lift pass offer when a child aged up to eight skis with a paying adult. This made the Italian resort over nine per cent cheaper than its closest rival Bardonecchia – a total of £1,797 compared with £1,984.
- However, the top four ski resorts registered some of the biggest barometer increases. While the increase across the 30 resorts surveyed averages 10.4 per cent, prices in Passo Tonale are up 14.4 per cent and those in Bardonecchia have risen by 10.5 per cent. Third-placed Bansko has seen an even bigger increase of 15.6 per cent to £2,093.
- The most significant increase has been in Kranjska Gora, which has fallen from second to fourth place in this season's family table on the back of a 23.5 per cent year-on-year price rise to £2,117. Previous reports have commented on volatility in the cost of tuition from one year to the next in the Slovenian resort and this season is no exception. At £666 for a week's tuition for two adults and two children aged six and eight, prices are two-thirds higher than last season's cost of £399 – although they are cheaper than in the 2023/24 season when researchers priced ski school at £810.

## Best value resorts for family skiers (continued)

- There is a greater mix of countries represented in this year's best value top ten resorts for families. Italy takes four places in the leading ten with Sestriere (9th, £2,500, up 4.9 per cent) and La Thuile (10th, £2,576, +12.3 per cent) joining Passo Tonale and Bardonecchia. However, there are also two Norwegian resorts – Beitostølen (5th, £2,179, prices up 7.5 per cent) and Geilo (6th, £2,293, +2.1 per cent) – as well as Andorra's Arinsal in eighth place at £2,441 (+4.4 per cent) and a new entrant, Finland's Pyha, coming seventh with a barometer total of £2,404.
- The only ski resort to register a fall in prices compared with last season is Soldeu. At £2,602 for a family of four, prices have dropped 3.7 per cent to move the Andorran resort up from 18th place last year to 11th position now.
- Saalbach in Austria remains the most expensive of the 30 ski resorts surveyed for families. At £4,060 (+20.5 per cent), Saalbach is almost £500 pricier than Les Arcs (£3,564), although prices in the French resort are up 21.2 per cent.

Laura Plunkett, Head of Post Office Travel Money, said:

**"Families may have to dig deeper in their pockets in the coming ski season but there is still great value to be had if they choose carefully. The free lift passes for younger children in Passo Tonale makes it an unbeatable choice for parents with kids under nine, while the fall in prices we picked up in Soldeu makes this family-friendly ski resort an attractive option too."**



**"However, parents on a limited budget need to be aware of the widely varying prices for ski school if their children need tuition. Pyha, which is new to the Ski Resort Report this year, offers excellent value at half the price families could pay in more expensive French resorts. Our advice is to check prices before booking."**
